Earth Day River Cleanup Saturday, April 22, 2023

Fundraising Goal: \$6,500

The annual Earth Day River Cleanup at High Bridge Park is our largest river cleanup event of the year and brings hundreds of volunteers together to collect litter along the Spokane River and Hangman Creek. Last year, almost 200 volunteers cleaned up 4,900 pounds of shoreline trash as part of the great global Earth Day cleanup. This year we expect to see even more community members actively protecting the river together.

Big Water Salmon Jump & Spokane River Canoe Clinics

March - July 2023

Fundraising Goal: \$5000

The Big Water Salmon Jump is a Columbia River boating event that supports our tribal community canoe families and non-tribal paddlers journey down the Columbia River. Tribal canoes and other watercraft, will paddle in segments, for 397 miles – from Canada to the Snake River. Along the way, we share stories, build community, experience the Rivers of the Upper Columbia, and gather scientific information for the improvement of the health of the Columbia River and its tributaries.

In preparation for the journey and in collaboration with Charlie Birdhat SPC, Spokane Riverkeeper will sponsor two educational clinics on the Spokane River:

- Whitewater training and safety
- Water quality assessment and monitoring

These clinics will support a safe journey of well-trained paddlers and will advance the future of clean water advocacy and education in our community.



STRATEGIC GOALS

Strategic Goal 1 – Provide long term scientific assessments of the health of the Spokane River

We conduct temperature, turbidity and other scientific studies while engaging and educating through community science.

Strategic Goal 2 – Defend clean water and ecosystem health through Clean Water Defense

We stand with Waterkeepers across our State and the Nation using the Clean Water Act to defend our waterways and uphold its most basic premise that the public is entitled by law to protection of their public waters, the fish and recreation they provide.

Strategic Goal 3 – Promote healthy cold river flow in response to drought and population growth

We advocate for and participate in water conservation planning to protect healthy river flows.

Strategic Goal 4 – Keep the Spokane River and its tributaries clean, safe and litter free

We run a litter pick up program that has removed thousands of pounds of litter from our river banks and engaged hundreds of volunteers. Since 2016 we have hosted 331 cleanups, with 5,566 volunteers cleaning up 104,195 pounds or 52 tons of trash.

Strategic Goal 5 – Support native fish recovery and protection

We support the protection and recovery of redband trout and the Columbia Plateau Tribal-led efforts of the recovery of Chinook salmon to regional water ways.

Strategic Goal 6 – Connect communities to the river through outreach, education and collaboration.

We collaborate with the Spokane Salish School in river education and have an active homeless outreach program that puts community partners like Spokane Neighborhood Action Programs (SNAP) on the river to access and offer services to those in need.
